Pulmonary Function Testing Order

- PFT – Spirometry order will be discontinued.
- The consolidated Pulmonary Function Testing order has special instructions of options to choose from for specific testing. Special Instructions state:

- Select one option by placing a “X” in the parentheses:
 - () Complete
 - () Complete with pre and post bronchodilator if indicated
 - () Spirometry
 - () Spirometry with pre and post bronchodilator if indicated

- Updates to the ID Risk Screen PowerForm including:
 - Removal of Covid-19 screening and Monkeypox screening.
 - Responses consolidated into **Other Exposure to Infectious Disease** section.
 - Remove Ebola/MERs section.
 - Replaced by rules to fire isolation precautions based on symptoms and possible exposure.
 - Removing all symptom types to align with model.
 - Updating MDRO from a grid to a single question.

Inpatient

Non-Medication Skin Care Products

- The following non-medication skin care products used for skin hydration and not the treatment of a disease state have been removed from Order Sets and the order catalog:

- Lanolin
- A&D Ointment
- Vitamin A&D Topical Ointment

- To document Lanolin going forward:

- In the Adult Systems Assessment navigator band, go to the Postpartum section.
- The Treatments to Breasts section lists Lanolin as an option.

- To document A&D Ointment or Vitamin A&D Topical Ointment going forward:

- In the Adult Systems Assessment or ED Adult Systems Assessment navigator bands, go to the Integumentary section.
- The Brief/Diaper Rash Treatment section has an Occlusive ointment option available to select.

- The non-medication skin care products will become floor stock items and nursing should follow the current process of obtaining floor stock items.

Tuberculosis Testing

- The Tuberculosis Testing and Screening PowerForm will be removed.
- If the medication tuberculin purified protein derivative is ordered on the patient and administered via the MAR, then the system automatically places an order/task for PPD Reading and the order is set with a start date/time 48 hours after the medication was administered.
- Once 48 hours has elapsed, the PPD Reading task will access the POC PPD Reading PowerForm where the results are to be documented.

Emergency

Nursing Assistant Positions

- The Medication Administration Wizard (MAW) is being removed from the CAH Nursing Assistant positions within the FirstNet application since nursing assistants do not give medications.

Pharmacy

Electronic Prescribing of Controlled Substances

- Moving forward, EPCS requirements will be determined by both the state where the drug is prescribed (based on the encounter location) and the state where the destination pharmacy is located. The system will automatically apply and enforce the stricter EPCS requirements between the two states to ensure compliance.

Laboratory

Reference Range Updates

- Reference ranges and linearity ranges will be updated to standardize values across the system. This update supports consistency in results and interpretation.

Surgery

Perioperative Forms Update

- In order to standardize documentation and reduce double documentation see the following updates:
 - Preadmission Assessment is renamed to **Perioperative Preadmission Assessment**.
 - Replaced Depression screening section with **PHQ-2/PHQ-9**.
 - In the education section, Preprocedure Education is renamed to **Preadmission Education**.
 - **Allergies and Immunizations** will only be documented in the PAT Workflow and removed from the **Perioperative Preadmission Assessment** and the **Perioperative Preprocedure Intake Form**.

- Tabs within the Perioperative Preadmission Assessment are reordered for better workflow.
- The Perioperative Preprocedure Intake Form has the following sections added:

- Patient/Parent/Significant Other Desired to Learn
- Barriers To Learning
- Learning Style Preference
- Preprocedure Education
- Preprocedure Education Comments
- Accompanied By
- Accompanied By Names

- The Perioperative Preprocedure Intake Form updates the following naming conventions:

- Site Verified by Patient/Family update to **Procedure/Site Verified by Patient/Family**.
- Site Verified by RN updated to **Procedure/Site Verified by RN**.
- Site Verified by Physician updated to **Procedure/Site Verified by Physician**.
- Site Laterality Verified updated to **Procedure Laterality Verified**.

- The Perioperative PreProcedure Intake Form has replaced the Depression Screening section with the CSSRS Screeners section.
- Added a new **Education** section to replace the Preadmission Education section.
- Updated Preprocedure Checklist Short Form renamed to **Perioperative Preprocedure Checklist**.

Future Changes

To Be Determined

- Instead of using POC PowerForms, POC result values can be entered into the Point of Care Result Entry tool. Coming mid-2026.
- Reverse Interaction Checking will automatically run each time new allergies are entered and can be run at any time by clicking Reverse Allergy Check button.

- **Interaction is found:** Red warning populates with details. This is not auto dismissed.
- **No interaction is found:** Green checkmark with text **Success. No Drug Interaction found.** This message will auto-dismiss after 5 seconds.

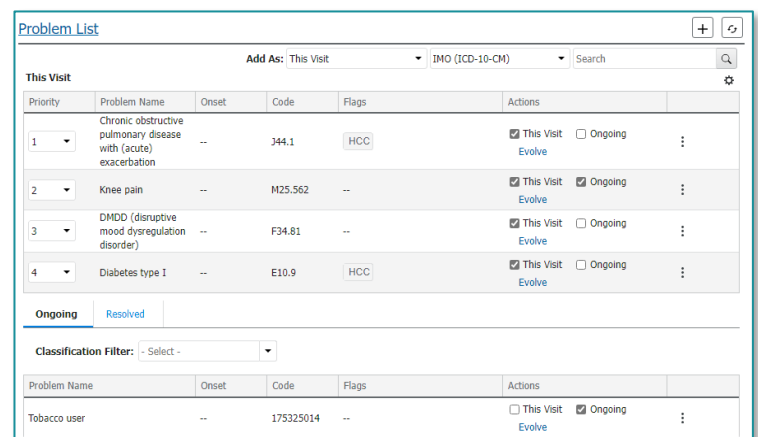
➤ **MyExperience Replacement**

- **MyExperience will be replaced with Role Profiles.** In the future, if more than one role exists there will be a prompt to choose a role when logging into an application.

➤ **Problem List Cloud**

- New tools for evolving problems, improved classification filters, problem summaries, and HCC indicators, with details below:

- Problems component will be renamed to **Problem List**.
- Separation and filtering of Problems into **This Visit** and **Ongoing**.
- Improved Nomenclature Search.
- Display of Classification Filters such as Dietary, Family History, Medical, Nursing, Past Medical History, Patient Stated, SDOH, Social History, Surgical History.

- Ability to **Evolve** Problems; a new ability to change the problem's code as the problem evolves. It also allows the ability to view a timeline of the problem's evolution.
- Narrative for Problem Summary can be viewed from the problem detail pane.
- **Resolve** action allows a treated or managed problem that is now considered clinically stable to be resolved . The problem will now show as part of the patient's problem history
- **Remove** action is the ability to remove an incorrect problem on the patient's chart.
 - The problem will be cancelled but still discoverable

- Ability to Favorite Problems
- Problem Summary is a narrative summary to all ongoing problems. This is intended to provide a brief synopsis of the management of that problem and current state.
 - If multiple problem summaries exist, the user can see all prior problem summaries by selecting the “View History” hyperlink. A comment icon will display if problem summary or comments are documented.
- HCC will now display in the Flags column.
 - HCC are tracked and reset on a calendar year basis (January 1 – December 31).
 - Diagnosis captured during this period determines the patient’s Risk Adjustment Factor (RAF) for the following year’s payment. Even if a condition is ongoing, it must be re-documented every year to be included in the risk score.
