


When a patient is being seen in a Primary Care location for Integrated Behavioral Health services, the BH Ambulatory Intake form can be accessed for intake documentation. In addition, the Behavioral Health Initial Screening form is available to document the common assessments for a visit.

Intake form

STEP 1: Navigate to the **Vital Signs** component on the Workflow MPage.

STEP 2: Select the drop-down arrow and select **BH Ambulatory Intake**.

- Document the sections within the form as applicable for the patient and visit location.


Locating Behavioral Health Assessment forms

STEP 1: Navigate to the **Vital Signs** component on the Workflow MPage.

STEP 2: Select the **plus (+)** sign to navigate to AdHoc.

STEP 3: Select the **Behavioral Health** folder.

STEP 4: Select **Behavioral Health Initial Screening**. This form will have the commonly used assessments performed at intake.
