

## From the Office of Clinical Informatics Bridge Breast Milk Management Discharge Bottles

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Bridge Breast Milk Management allows for an accurate snapshot of bottles for the newborn during their hospitalization. The use of the Discharge Bottles functionality ensures that the correct bottles are given to the correct person at the time the infant is discharged. Once the bottle is discharged, it cannot be combined, prepared, or administered.

## **Discharging Bottles**

<u>STEP 1</u>: Identify the patient by scanning the patient's ID from their wristband or by scanning the patient's storage label.

STEP 2: Select Discharge Bottles. The system displays all available bottles for the patient. The total bottle count is at the top of the table. Select the column headings to sort the column views.

**STEP 3**: Select a discharge location.

STEP 4: Select the Discharge check box for any bottles you want to discharge or select the Select All option to automatically select all bottles.



<u>STEP 5</u>: Select Discharge to discharge the bottles.



• Alternatively, you can scan a bottle number and press ENTER. If the bottle number was previously entered for the patient, the system updates the bottle to a Discharged status and reduces the available bottle count by one. The bottles continue to be displayed on the table as each bottle is scanned. Donor milk bottles and sibling bottles can be scanned.

STEP 6: When you have discharged all necessary bottles for the patient, select Exit. Discharged bottles and the discharge location can be viewed on the Browse Bottle History page.
