
FetaLink Adding a Second Monitor

FetaLink is a maternal and fetal monitoring system that facilitates the flow of data from medical devices in a manner that supports display needs of clinicians in the acute and ambulatory setting. When a patient is pregnant with triplets or quadruplets, a second fetal monitor will need to be added.


Adding a Second Fetal Monitor


<u>STEP 1</u>: From the patient's chart within the FetaLink chart, select Monitor Association.



STEP 2: Select the location and **Apply**.

STEP 3: To add the second monitor, scan the second monitor or select the Monitor Search link (on the Monitor Association box).






STEP 4: Address the pop-up warning asking if you want to add a second fetal monitor? Click OK to proceed with adding the second fetal monitor?

If adding the second fetal monitor manually, select the correct (2nd) fetal monitor from the list of available monitors and click **Apply** to complete the selection.


STEP 5: Both fetal monitors will display in the Monitor Association box the patient will be associated with. Verify the monitors

are accurate.

STEP 6: Select **Apply** to complete the association.

NOTE: Triplets and Quadruplets require two fetal monitors but will display on one fetal strip.

- Currently FetaLink does not support triplet monitors, so a second monitor will need to be added.
- ➤ Both monitors will display in the demographic banner for the patient.





<u>STEP 7</u>: If the encounter wasn't selected when beginning the process, select the encounter for the patient that will be monitored.
