
The Lactation Organizer assists the lactation consultant with reviewing patient requests and having information in one location. This flyer will review the process for using the Lactation Organizer.

Lactation Organizer


The Lactation Organizer will assist the lactation consultant with having information available in one location for patients requesting lactation services.

Lactation Organizer

• From the toolbar, select Lactation Organizer.



• Select your patient list.




NOTE: If your patient list isn't available, your list will need to be added following the steps for List Maintenance.


- List Maintenance.
 - Select List Maintenance.
 - Click New.
 - From your member organization, select your floor.
 - Move from the left-hand side to the right-hand side of the window.
- Establish Relationships.

• Select the patient/patients that you are assigned

to and set the relationship.

- Select Establish.
- Information will then be viewable for each patient.






List Maintenance

Establish Relationships

- Patient Search.
 - Can be used to search for a specific patient.
- Customizing Columns.
 - From the drop down, select the columns you wish to have on view.
 - These can also be dragged to the order you want to view the information.
- Information in this component, includes Location, Patient, Maternal Information, Newborn Information, Glucose Level, Diagnoses, and Problems.
- Highlight your patient.
- Several of the columns provide additional information when you click in the column for the patient's row.
 - Patient.
 - This will display basic demographic information about the patient.
 - Maternal Information.
 - This column will display the gestation description, breastfeeding history, risk factors for the mother and the newborn.
 - Newborn Information.
 - Information in this column includes the Latch Score and the Transcutaneous Bilirubin POC.
 - Glucose level.
 - In the column, the latest result displays, to view previous glucose levels, click on the column.














- Diagnoses.
 - Displays the patient's diagnosis list.
 - Problems.
 - This column will display the patient's problem list.

Documentation

- Selecting the patient name, will bring you to the patient's chart.
- From the Neonate Workflow MPage, for documenting in the baby's chart, click the header, Neonate Overview. Newborn Breastfeeding Assessment
- From iView, navigate to the Newborn Breastfeeding Assessment.
- Document as appropriate and **Sign** when complete.
- In the Lactation Monitoring, select the WC\$ Lactation **Consult Duration Contact** to select the appropriate charges.
- To document on mom's chart Breast Assessment, select Related **Records** from the toolbar.





- Click the header in the Admission component to launch iView.
- Document mom's breast assessment in the OB Systems Assessment band.
