


The Asthma Action Plan is education provided to families regarding treatment of their child's asthma. The component is available for both inpatient and ambulatory providers.

Asthma Action Plan


The **Asthma Action Plan** component can be found in the Amb Pediatrics 2018 and Inpt Pediatrics 2018 MPages.

STEP 1: Use the plus sign (+) to create a new **Asthma Action Plan**.

STEP 2: Complete the **Asthma Control Screening Form** by clicking the blue hyperlink.



STEP 5: Complete each zone and address medications as appropriate for each zone.
