

IV Fluid Conservation Update: Fentanyl Infusions

WHEN: Tuesday, December 3, 2024

WHERE: The change will affect the following venue(s):

• Acute/Inpatient (to include ED & Peri-Op)

At the following NLH Member Organization(s):

• All NLH organizations, excluding NL Mayo Hospital

WHO: The change will affect the following staff at the above noted locations:

- Inpatient Nursing
- Inpatient Providers
- Inpatient Pharmacists
- WHAT: The Witnessed by: field at time of medication charting documentation for Fentanyl 2500mcg/50ml, was made required on November 14 for NL EMMC as an emergency safety mechanism. On December 3, all <u>NLH member-organization</u> <u>hospitals using Cerner Millennium</u> will align in the following ways:
 - IV Fentanyl infusions will transition from a compound of 2500mcg/250ml to a straight infusion of the drug from a 2500mcg/50ml vial.
 - Only a single concentration option will be available to order fentanyl infusions with all additional options being removed. This includes orders within PowerPlans.
 - All locations, NL EMMC included, the **Witnessed by:** field will be required for **Fentanyl 2500mcg/50ml**.
 - The new concentration will be the only available option on infusion pumps: Fentanyl 2500mcg/50ml.
 - New 2500mcg/50ml vials will be stocked in **Pyxis MedStation** in areas with high utilization.

- An alert will be added at **Pyxis MedStation** upon removal and inventory actions of the Fentanyl 2500mcg/50ml vial: ****This is a new concentration** of fentanyl, please double check pump concentration selection.******

NOTE: Please contact your local inpatient pharmacy with questions or concerns.

- **WHY:** To conserve IV fluids currently experiencing shortage and to add additional safety mechanisms for accurate and safe medication administration.
- **HOW:** Follow normal ordering and documentation workflows, with special attention to alerts and required fields.
